
CEPF – the voice of European Private Forest Owners

- Founded in Luxembourg in 1996, but with roots back to early 60's
- Registered as an association sans but lucratif (asbl) in Belgium since 2012
- The umbrella federation of family forestry in Europe
- Represents and promotes the common interests of private forest owners in Europe
- CEPF serves the interests of the approximately 16 million forest owners. They are
 private individuals, families and cooperatives that take care of about 60% of
 Europe's forests.



Diversity of private forest ownership

- About 60% of forests privately owned
- Approx. 16 million forest owners
- Small scale forest holdings (average size within EU
 13 ha, but most own 2-5 ha)
- 83% individuals/families; 12% forest industries; 5% private institutions
- New types of PFOs (e.g. urbanisation)
- 20-30% pensioners



CEPF and Forest Pedagogics & Communication

Main Principles of Forest Pedagogy in Europe

- addresses all social, environmental and economic dimensions of sustainability
- fosters understanding, interactions and relationships of human-environmental relations in the context of sustainable development
- is based on knowledge about forest ecosystems and experience in sustainable forestry
- promotes understanding, use and application of the concept of sustainable development through the example of sustainable forest management
- demands an holistic approach and it considers world-wide coherences

- contributes to education for sustainable development (ESD) and the UN-Decade for ESD
- cooperates with other partners engaged in environmental education or ESD
- requires active and cooperative educational methods and approaches
- values, promotes and offers forests as a healthy and excellent learning environment for outdoor education as well as a resource for learning
- encompasses natural and cultural heritage

- Economic viability of the forest holding as well as competiveness of the forest and forest-based sector






Overall goals of CEPF communications










EU Forest Policy: a complex scattered puzzle


















EU forest industry has warned Brussels that the proposed sustainability system for forest biomass could prevent the EU from reaching its targets to cut CO2 emissions from the energy sector

European forest owners, managers and professionals argued in a joint paper that the European Commission's proposal to revise the Renewable Energy Directive (RED) had been too hasty in developing a new regulatory framework that could cause "additional, unnecessary burdens".

The position, signed by associations including farmers' lobby Copa-Copeca, state forest association Eustafor and forest owners' representative CEPF, argued that existing European and national policies and regulation are sufficient to ensure the sustainability of forest biomass used for energy generation.

"We manage our forests holistically, regardless of the end product," Emma Berglund, CEPF secretary general told ENDS. Specific rules for biomass used for energy could entail additional administrative burdens and risk creating a system "that does not fit with the existing system we have",

Under the revised RED, the Commission proposed a new risk-based approach to minimise the use of unsustainable







- Organised by chamber of agriculture and forestry in Styria in collaboration with proHolz Styria






